Tour Itinerary

Day 1: Arrive Mumbai

- Upon arrival in Mumbai, you will be met by our representative and transferred to your hotel. The rest of the day is at leisure to relax after your journey.

Day 2: Mumbai

- After breakfast at the hotel, visit the Gateway of India, a colossal monument overlooking the Arabian Sea, built in 1924 to commemorate the visit of King George V and Queen Mary.
- Take a boat ride to the Elephanta Caves, a UNESCO World Heritage Site with impressive rock-cut cave temples dedicated to Lord Shiva, featuring intricately carved sculptures and reliefs.
- Explore Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Vastu Sangrahalaya, formerly the Prince of Wales Museum, showcasing a vast collection of ancient artifacts, artworks, and natural history exhibits.
- Visit Chhatrapati Shivaji Terminus, India's most famous railway station, an architectural marvel blending Victorian Gothic and traditional Indian styles, and a UNESCO World Heritage Site.
- See the iconic Taj Mahal Palace Hotel, a symbol of luxury and heritage in Mumbai, known for its stunning architecture and historical significance.

- Walk along Marine Drive, also known as the Queen's Necklace, for stunning views of the Arabian Sea and the Mumbai skyline.
- Visit the Hanging Gardens, a terraced garden perched atop Malabar Hill, offering panoramic views of the city.
- Return to your hotel for an overnight stay.

Day 3: Mumbai - Aurangabad (flight)

- After breakfast at the hotel, transfer to the airport for your flight to Aurangabad.
- Upon arrival, transfer to your hotel.
- Visit Bibi Ka Maqbara, a 17th-century mausoleum resembling the Taj Mahal, known as the "Taj of the Deccan," built by Aurangzeb's son in memory of his mother.
- Explore the Aurangabad Caves, a group of 12 Buddhist caves carved out of the hillside, featuring intricate carvings and sculptures depicting Buddhist deities and stories.
- Visit Panchakki, an ancient water mill that demonstrates the city's ingenious water management system, and the adjoining garden.
- Explore the vibrant local markets of Aurangabad, known for their Paithani saris, Himroo shawls, and Bidriware.
- Overnight stay in Aurangabad.

Day 4: Aurangabad - Ajanta - Aurangabad (210kms round)

- After breakfast at the hotel, embark on a full-day excursion to Ajanta Caves.
- Explore the UNESCO World Heritage Site, known for beautiful rock-cut caves, paintings, and sculptures depicting the life and teachings of Buddha.
- Marvel at the intricate frescoes and sculptures dating back to the 2nd century BC, showcasing scenes from the Jataka tales and various events from Buddha's life.
- Visit the viewpoints offering panoramic views of the caves and the surrounding landscape.
- Return to Aurangabad for an overnight stay.

Day 5: Aurangabad - Ellora - Aurangabad (120kms)

- After breakfast at the hotel, explore the Ellora Caves, a UNESCO World Heritage Site.
- Visit the group of 34 rock-cut temples and monasteries dedicated to Buddhism, Hinduism, and Jainism, carved into the Charanandri Hills.

- Admire the Kailasa Temple, the largest monolithic rock excavation in the world, dedicated to Lord Shiva, showcasing incredible architectural and sculptural details.
- Visit the Buddhist, Hindu, and Jain caves, each featuring unique art and architecture representing their respective religions.
- Visit Daulatabad Fort, a 14th-century fort known for its formidable defenses, strategic location, and historical significance.
- Explore the various parts of the fort, including the Chand Minar, the royal palaces, and the underground passages.
- Return to Aurangabad for an overnight stay.

Day 6: Aurangabad - Delhi (flight)

- After breakfast at the hotel, transfer to the airport for your flight to Delhi.
- Upon arrival, transfer to your hotel.
- Spend the rest of the day at leisure or explore the city on your own.
- Overnight stay in Delhi.

Day 7: Delhi

- After breakfast at the hotel, visit the Red Fort, a UNESCO World Heritage Site and a symbol of India's rich history, built by Mughal Emperor Shah Jahan.
- Explore Jama Masjid, one of the largest mosques in India, built by Shah Jahan, featuring a vast courtyard and stunning architecture.
- Visit Raj Ghat, a memorial dedicated to Mahatma Gandhi, where an eternal flame burns in his honor.
- See India Gate, a war memorial arch honoring the soldiers of the Indian Army who died in World War I, surrounded by lush gardens and fountains.
- Drive past the Parliament House, President's House, and other Government Secretarial Buildings, showcasing the grandeur of British colonial architecture.
- Explore Connaught Place, a bustling commercial and financial hub with shops, restaurants, and entertainment options.
- Explore Qutub Minar, a 73-meter-tall tower built in the 12th century, and another UNESCO World Heritage Site, showcasing Indo-Islamic architecture.
- Visit Humayun's Tomb, the first garden-tomb on the Indian subcontinent and a UNESCO World Heritage Site, built in memory of the Mughal Emperor Humayun.

- Visit the Lotus Temple, an architectural marvel known for its flower-like shape and open to people of all religions for meditation and prayer.
- Return to your hotel for an overnight stay.

Day 8: Delhi - Agra (210kms)

- After breakfast at the hotel, drive to Agra, the city of the Taj Mahal.
- Upon arrival, check into your hotel.
- Visit the Taj Mahal, a UNESCO World Heritage Site and one of the Seven Wonders of the World, built by Mughal Emperor Shah Jahan in memory of his beloved wife Mumtaz Mahal, featuring exquisite white marble architecture and intricate inlay work.
- Explore Agra Fort, a UNESCO World Heritage Site and a red sandstone fort built by Emperor Akbar, featuring beautiful palaces, mosques, and audience halls.
- Visit the Tomb of Itimad-ud-Daulah, also known as the "Baby Taj," an exquisite marble mausoleum built by Nur Jahan for her father, with intricate pietra dura work.
- Stroll through the Mehtab Bagh, a garden complex across the Yamuna River offering stunning views of the Taj Mahal at sunset.
- Overnight stay in Agra.

Day 9: Agra - Fatehpur Sikri - Abhaneri - Jaipur (245kms)

- After breakfast at the hotel, drive to Jaipur.
- En route, visit Fatehpur Sikri, the deserted city of the Mughal Empire built by Emperor Akbar in the 16th century, featuring well-preserved palaces, courtyards, and mosques.
- Explore the Jama Masjid, Buland Darwaza, Panch Mahal, and other historical sites in Fatehpur Sikri.
- Continue the drive to Abhaneri, a small village known for its well-preserved stepwell, Chand Baori, one of the largest and deepest stepwells in India.
- Admire the intricate architecture and geometric patterns of Chand Baori, with its 3,500 steps arranged in perfect symmetry.
- Proceed to Jaipur and check into your hotel.
- Overnight stay in Jaipur.

Day 10: Jaipur

- After breakfast at the hotel, visit the stunning Amber Fort, a UNESCO World Heritage Site and former capital of the Kachwaha Rajputs.
- Enjoy an elephant ride or jeep ride up to the fort, and explore its impressive palaces, courtyards, and gardens.
- Visit the City Palace, a blend of Mughal and Rajasthani architecture, housing museums, courtyards, and the residence of the royal family.
- Explore Jantar Mantar, an astronomical observatory built by Maharaja Jai Singh II, and a UNESCO World Heritage Site, featuring a collection of architectural astronomical instruments.
- Drive past the famous Hawa Mahal or "Palace of Winds," known for its unique façade with 953 small windows, designed to allow royal ladies to observe street festivals without being seen.
- Visit the Albert Hall Museum, showcasing a rich collection of artifacts, paintings, and sculptures from Rajasthan's history and culture.
- Explore the vibrant local markets of Jaipur, famous for textiles, jewelry, handicrafts, and traditional Rajasthani attire.
- Return to your hotel for an overnight stay.

Day 11: Jaipur - Delhi (265kms)

- After breakfast at the hotel, check-out and drive to Delhi.
- Upon arrival, check into your hotel.
- Spend the rest of the day at leisure or exploring the city on your own.
- Overnight stay in Delhi.
